Students who are permitted to develop “make-up work” to attend the Sunday-to-Sunday IBI-CEO Space FEAST educational program will participate in all-day educational classes. The decade old program focuses on the following topics:

The majority of IBI-CEO Space program graduates proceed to complete higher education.

The Teen FEAST Applicant named below has been reviewed and approved to attend the IBI-CEO Space Free Enterprise Accelerated Support Training for the week indicated in this letter. Each approved student will complete all course material, including written and oral examinations and be certified in Multiple Venture Technologies with a graduate certificate upon course completion.
